ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES

The Choice Based Credit System (CBCS):

Gauhati University has introduced into the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) from the 2019-2020 academic session. All affiliated Colleges implemented the CBCS in their under-graduate programme in accordance with the regulation of the under graduate choice based Credit System (UG CBCS) Gauhati University, 2019.

Under Graduate CBCS (UG CBCS) Programmes:

The undergraduate degree programme in the CBCS will have courses spread across sixsemester. Two Consecutive (one odd and one even) semesters will make up an academic year. An UG course shall be of six semesters covering three calendar years (Academic session –June to May) The duration of the odd semester (First, third and fifth) shall be from June to November, and that of even semesters (Second, Fourth and Sixth) shall be from December to May.

Nature and Nomenclature of Courses:

In line with the UGC's guidelines, the courses are categorized as core courses, Elective courses or ability Enhancement courses.

* Core Courses:

A core course is a course that has to be compulsorily studied. A student in an under graduate degree programme with Honours will have to take up 14 core courses, each of 6 credits. In a Regular under graduate degree programme a student will need to take up 12 core courses, each again of 6 credits.

* Elective Courses:

An elective course is to be chosen by the students from a pool of such courses on offer and will essentially be of three types.

Discipline specific Elective Course :

An elective course which is offered by the main discipline. Dissertation project can be taken as an option in lieu of a 6 credit Discipline specific course in the sixth semester only.

Generic Elective Course: A Generic Elective Course is offered by an unrelated discipline and has the objective of broadening the academic experience of a student. A student can select any Generic Elective course from the pool that the college is offering.

* Ability Enhancement courses:

Ability Enhancement courses will be of two types.

Ability Enhancement Compulsory courses (AECC): Ability Enhancement Compulsory courses of 4 credit courses are mandatory. A student will have to take up 4 credit course in English Communication/ MIL communication in the 1st semester and Environmental Science in the 2nd semester.

Skill Enhancement courses(SEC): Skill Enhancement courses that would be skill based will have to be selected from the pool of the courses on offer. The Gauhati University has prepared skill Enhancement Courses for various disciplines from the list of SEC provided by the UGC template. However Colleges are free to develop their own SECs independently which must have prior approved of the Academic Council.

STRUCTURE OF COURSES AND CREDITS OF THE UG CBCS PROGRAMMES

For the purpose of computation of work-load the following mechanism is to be adopted.

1 Credit = 1 Theory period of one hour duration.

1 Credit = 1 Tutorial period of one hour duration.

1 Credit = 1 Practical period of two hour duration.

■ EXAMINATION AND EVALUATION PROCEDURE (FOR DETAILS SEE GU REGULATION FOR UG CBCS):

A student's performance will be evaluated throughout the year based on continuous assessment. Evaluation of the student's performance in each semester for every course/paper will be based on the following:

A) Internal Assessment (IA)

B) End Semester Examination (ESE)

For a student to pass in a course/paper, she/he has to pass on the basis of the marks secured in TOTALITY in both Internal Assessment and End Semester Examination.

- A) Internal Assessment (IA): IA will ideally account for 20% of the total marks allotted to a course/paper. For evaluating the performance of the students in a continuous way, the following measures will be adopted for distributing marks earmarked for IA.
- i) Sessional or mid-term examination will be conducted for 50% of the total marks allotted for IA of a course/paper. (For example, if 20 marks is allotted for IA of a course/paper, then 10 marks will be kept aside for assessment in sessional or mid-term examination. The sessional examination will be held for 30 marks for the convenience of setting questions and covering the syllabus and the marks secured by the students will be proportionately converted to be out of 10 marks. Duration of the examination will be one hour. The evaluated answer scripts will be shown to the students and corrections will be made, if any.
- ii) 20% of the marks allotted for IA will be awarded to the students based on class attendance. If the total marks for IA is 20, then 4 marks will be awarded to the students based on class attendance. The following criteria will be adopted for awarding marks under this category:
 - a) Class attendance from 76% to 80% 1 marks;
 - b) Class attendance from 81% to 85% 2 marks;
 - c) Class attendance from 86% to 90%3 marks;
 - d) Class attendance from 91% and above4 marks.
- iii) Rest 30% of the marks (i.e. 6 marks) allotted for IA will be distributed and awarded on the basis of performance of the students on the following criteria:
- a) For Practical courses: Practical (internal practical including practical copy)
- b) For Non-Practical courses: Home Assignments, Seminar / Group discussion, Field work, performance in Co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.

B) End Semester Examination(ESE):

The ESE will comprise of 80% of the total marks earmarked for a course. The ESE shall be of three hours duration for a course whose ESE component exceeds 50 marks. For a student to pass in a course/paper, his/her marks in both Internal Assessment and End Semester Examination will be accounted in TOTALITY.

- For Courses with Practical, ESE will be conducted as per theory (60 marks) plus Practical (20 marks).
- For Courses without Practical, the ESE will be conducted for 80 marks.

Pass Marks: The conditions for successful completion (Pass) of a course is as per the Grading Template [10.3.7] as given in the GU Regulations for UG CBCS. (Go through GU website)

Admission into the next Semester:

These will be held as per guideline issued from Gauhati University.

ATTENDANCE:

- A student should attend at least 75% of the classes held failing which he/she may be debarred from appearing in the End Semester examinations & sessional examinations.
- College seat as well as Major seat will be forfeited if a student remains absent from his
 classes continuously for 10 days without any information or prior permission from
 the departmental heads.
- In both the cases, no amount will be refunded. Rather fine may be imposed.

DIPLOMA / CERTIFICATE COURSES

A) Certificate Course in "Training on Production, Processing and Marketing of Azolla"

(A bio-fertilizer, bio-scavengeras well as green fodder for Cattle and Livestock)

Objective of the Course:

- (i) To demonstrate the participants about the Azolla fern and its importance as bio-fertilizer, bio-scavenger as well as green fodder for cattle and Livestock.
- (ii) To train them with the techniques for mass cultivation and processing of Azolla.
- (iii) To make them understand the potential field of marketing of the Azolla and its products.

Course Outcome:

Trained participants shall be able to establish Azolla cultivation form. To produce Azolla as bio-fertilizer as well as green fodder for cattle and livestock. Thus they can be able to sell their farm products around the year, as-green fodder for dairy farming, dry flakes as poultry feed, green manure for paddy fields, azolla compost for household horticultural purposeand foroganic kitchen garden etc.

An entrepreneur (an entrepreneur can take up azolla cultivation as income generating activity in larger scale)

■ ANTI-RAGGING MEASURES IN THE COLLEGE:

B GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS:

- Students should take care of the college property and should help in keeping the premises neat and clean. Any damage done to the property of the college is a breach of discipline.

- Malpractices in examination shall be severely dealt with.
- Any of the following acts by a student shall be considered as an offence against discipline.
 - Any offence committed by a student that goes against good administration and good working order of the college.
 - (ii) Habitual unpunctuality.
 - (iii) Various forms of immoral acts.
 - (iv) Use of any intoxicating drugs in the premises and compound of the college.
 - (v) Showing discourtesy to the teachers and staff members in any form.
 - (vi) Restoring violence of any kind.
 - (vii) Holding any meeting or party of a political character in the campus without prior written permission or against the order of the Principal.
 - (viii) Any act that is an offence and punishable under the Indian Penal Code or punishable under any special or local laws.
 - (ix) Ragging of any form.

COLLEGE UNIFORM:

Students shall have to come to the college in college uniform prescribed by the college. Newly admitted students can get information regarding uniform from the Uniform Advisory Committee of the college.

For breach of college discipline by a student, the Principal is authorized to punish the offender with appropriate punishment such as imposition of fine, suspension from the college, rustication or expulsion from the college as well as from the hostel in case of boarders, suspension, forfeiture or withdrawal of scholarship and other concessions attached to any scholarship, cancellation of all concessions.

The Head of the institution may order any undesirable and troublesome scholar to leave the institution without assigning any reason if such action is considered to be necessary for the good of the institution.

All powers for maintenance of discipline in the college are vested with the Principal and his decision shall be final in all such matters.
