ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES

Four Year Under Graduate Programme (FYUGP)

The Four year under graduate programme under Gauhati University is based on the National Education Policy (NEP 2020). The FYUGP is design to cater to the diverse academic needs of the student and seeks to offer options of multiple entries / exits and obtain a certificate of a diploma or degree with or without major or a degree (Honours) or a degree (Honours) with research at various levels as stipulated under the policy.

Gauhati University has introduced into the FYUGP from the 2023-24 academic session. A affiliated colleges will be implemented the FYUGP in their under graduate programmes in accordance with the regulation of the FYUGP 2023 in line with the NEP 2020.

The complete FYUGP consists of 8 semesters, to be completed in a minimum of 4 academic years. Each academic year has two semesters. Each semester has a maximum 9 credit allocation of 22. All together the minimum credit requirements for a 3-year programme is 120 and for a 4-year programme, its 160. The minimum credit requirements for GU's FYUGP is as follows:

(a) Semester I: 22 (b) Semester II: 22 (c) Semester III: 22 (d) Semester IV: 18 (e) Semester V: 18

(f) Semester VI: 18 (g) Semester VII, VIII: 40 (h) Total: 160

FIGURE: 1 FOR MAJOR COURSES





FIGURE: 2 FOR MINOR COURSES



CREDITS

In GU-FYUGP, all credits are calculated on a weekly-basis A week is a span of days starting from one Monday to the next Sunday. The conversion from credit to contact hour of teaching is as follows.

1 Credit = 1 Hour of Theory Class OR

1 Credit = 2 Hours of Practical Class

PROGRESSION AND EXITS

The progression and exits during the whole course structure is given below.

(a) After 1 Year

One can exit just after one-year. In this case, the student will have to complete one extra Vocational / Skill course (Exit Course) of 4 credits and can exit the programme. The student will get a Certificate. The minimum total credit requirements is 44 (and 4 credit extra for the exit Vocational / Skill course).

(b) After 2 Years

One can exit the programme after two-year course as well. In this case, the student will have to complete one extra Vocational / Skill course of 4 credits and can exit the programme. The student will get a Diploma. The minimum total credit requirements is 84 (and 4 credits extra for the exit Vocational / Skill course).

(c) After 3 Years

If a student completes 3 years, he/she can exit the programme. In this case the student will get a Bachelor's Degree. The minimum total credit requirements is 120.

(d) After 4 Years

After completion of 4 years, the student gets either a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) or a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) with Research. The minimum total credit requirements is 160.

It should be noted that any certificate / diploma / degree is awarded only if the student clears (i.e. passes) all the required courses (papers) till that point of time.

PROSPECTUS

■ EXAMINATION AND EVALUATION PROCEDURE (FOR DETAILS SEE GU REGULATION FOR FYUGP

A student's performance will be evaluated throughout the year based on continuous assessment. Evaluation of the student's performance in each semester for every course/paper will be based on the following:

This will be modified later as per 60 Notification.

A) Internal Assessment (IA)

Go to GU website

B) End Semester Examination (ESE)

For a student to pass in a course/paper, she/he has to pass on the basis of the marks secured in TOTALITY in both Internal Assessment and End Semester Examination.

- A) Internal Assessment (IA): IA will ideally account for 20% of the total marks allotted to a course/paper. For evaluating the performance of the students in a continuous way, the following measures will be adopted for distributing marks earmarked for IA.
- i) Sessional or mid-term examination will be conducted for 50% of the total marks allotted for IA of a course/paper. (For example, if 20 marks is allotted for IA of a course/paper, then 10 marks will be kept aside for assessment in sessional or mid-term examination. The sessional examination will be held for 30 marks for the convenience of setting questions and covering the syllabus and the marks secured by the students will be proportionately converted to be out of 10 marks. Duration of the examination will be one hour. The evaluated answer scripts will be shown to the students and corrections will be made, if any.
- ii) 20% of the marks allotted for IA will be awarded to the students based on class attendance. If the total marks for IA is 20, then 4 marks will be awarded to the students based on class attendance. The following criteria will be adopted for awarding marks under this category:
 - a) Class attendance from 76% to 80% 1 marks;
 - b) Class attendance from 81% to 85% 2 marks;
 - c) Class attendance from 86% to 90%3 marks;
 - d) Class attendance from 91% and above4 marks.
- iii) Rest 30% of the marks (i.e. 6 marks) allotted for IA will be distributed and awarded on the basis of performance of the students on the following criteria:
- a) For Practical courses: Practical (internal practical including practical copy)
- b) For Non-Practical courses: Home Assignments, Seminar / Group discussion, Field work, performance in Co-curricular and extra- curricular activities.

B) End Semester Examination(ESE):

The ESE will comprise of 80% of the total marks earmarked for a course. The ESE shall be of three hours duration for a course whose ESE component exceeds 50 marks. For a student to pass in a course/paper, his/her marks in both Internal Assessment and End Semester Examination will be accounted in TOTALITY.

- For Courses with Practical, ESE will be conducted as per theory (60 marks) plus Practical (20 marks).
- For Courses without Practical, the ESE will be conducted for 80 marks.

Pass Marks: The conditions for successful completion (Pass) of a course is as per the Grading Template [10.3.7] as given in the GU Regulations for UG CBCS. (Go through GU website)

Admission into the next Semester:

These will be held as per guideline issued from Gauhati University.

ATTENDANCE:

- A student should attend at least 75% of the classes held failing which he/she may be debarred from appearing in the End Semester examinations & sessional examinations.
- College seat as well as Major seat will be forfeited if a student remains absent from his
 classes continuously for 10 days without any information or prior permission from
 the departmental heads.
- In both the cases, no amount will be refunded. Rather fine may be imposed.

(A bio-fertilizer, bio-scavengeras well as green fodder for Cattle and Livestock)

Objective of the Course:

- (i) To demonstrate the participants about the Azolla fern and its importance as bio-fertilizer, bio-scavenger as well as green fodder for cattle and Livestock.
- (ii) To train them with the techniques for mass cultivation and processing of Azolla.
- (iii) To make them understand the potential field of marketing of the Azolia and its products.

Course Outcome:

Trained participants shall be able to establish Azolla cultivation farm. To produce Azolla as bio-fertilizer as well as green fodder for cattle and livestock. Thus they can be able to sell their farm products around the year, as-green fodder for dairy farming, dry flakes as poultry feed, green manure for paddy fields, azolla compost for household horticultural purposeand foroganic kitchen garden etc.

- Arranging seminars, popular talks through debate club, nature club and extension cell.
- Training on maintenance and repairing of equipments and other activities by the Physics Department through' Physics Club'.
- Arranging training for Nursery, Mushroom growing and cultivation, Orchid preservation techniques by Botany and Zoology department in addition to field survey.
- Holding awareness programmes on health, hygiene, environment and other important issues.
- Publication of 'Uttaran'-the wall magazine of frequent intervals.
- Publishing college magazine 'Purbakash' and news bulletin 'Dawn'.
- Holding 'Tree Plantation Programme' with the help of students, NGOs and Govt. departments.
- In addition to all these, college arranges Fine Arts Competition, Music Competition Quize Competition,
 online essay writing competition etc among the students and field excursion from time to time.
- NSS: Students interested in social service may extend their cooperation through NSS wing of the college.
- Women Cell: The Women Cell endeavors for women empowerment of the locality as well as girls students of the college through various activities.
- Internal quality Assurance Cell (IQAC): The College has constituted the cell as per directives of NAAC for quality
 assurance, sustenance and enhancement, IQAC conducts/organizes various programmes in the College.
- Internal Committees/Cells: In order to achieve the objectives of the institution and for smooth functioning of various activities, the college has instituted committees/sub committees and cells.
- Sports & Cultural Meet, Fitness Club: Keeping in mind that 'health is wealth', the sports section of the college
 organizes annual sports and cultural meet usually in the month of December / January, During the annual sports
 competitions various events like debate, art, quiz, dancing, singing etc. are held. Apart from these special
 programmes, seminars, discussion, short courses, cultural functions fitness activities like Yoga, Meditation,
 Trekking are organized to encourage the student's skill in various aspects. Moreover, the college always
 encourages students to participate in any district level, state level or national level competitions.
- Gymnasium: College offers a multi-gym room equipped with modern instruments for the use of staff and students.
- Seminar and Popular Lecture: Seminar and popular lectures are arranged by the college/ departments for broadening students field of knowledge and views and for strengthening his/her ability to express. Students have to attend /deliver seminar classes regularly arranged by the departments.
- Alumni Association: An Alumni association is formed where all the ex-Birjhorians are included, Meeting and get -together are arranged among the alumni from time to time. College community has been observing the day of 1st September of every year as the foundation day of the college. This programme facilitaties the ex-students to meet each other and where they can exchange their views. Membership of Alumni Association can be obtained by paying a sum of rupees one hundred as membership fee at the time of exit from the collage.

- Career Guidance Cell: The career guidance cell of the college facilitates students to get first hand information regarding career opportunities and other related guidance.
 Personality development programmes are conducted under RUSA Finishing School.
- Grievance Redressal Cell: There is a Grievance redressal cell in the college to enable the students/staff to convey their grievance through the coordinator of the cell to the authority.
- Blotech HUB: Biotech Hub has been established with financial aid from DBT (Department of Biotechnology of Govt. of India) to promote the knowledge of Biotechnology as well as to enhance the interest in the Research activities in this field.

ANTI-RAGGING MEASURES IN THE COLLEGE:

Ragging is a criminal offence and UGC has framed Regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions in order to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging.

As per the guidelines of UGC and DHE, Govt. of Assam, College authority has constituted one Anti-Ragging Cell followed by Anti-Ragging Squad as preventive measures for prevention of ragging within the college campus. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against the students who are involved with any type of ragging. Students in distress owing to ragging related incidents may approach the Anti-Ragging Cell immediately. Each and every student of the college must have to fill up and submit online affidavit in this regard from the current academic session.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS:

Emphasis is laid on discipline and character building and students are expected to maintain high standards. They have to obey the existing rules and regulations of the college.

- Ragging eve teasing in any form is strictly prohibited.
- Students should be co-operative with all the development works of the college.
- They must attend classes (theory as well as practical) according to the timetable on all working days.
- The conduct and behavior of the students in the premises of the college as well as in their classes and examination halls should be such that it will cause no disturbance to the fellow students or other classes.
- Students should be away from doing anything either inside or outside the college campus, which hamper the prestige of the college.
- No Society should be formed in the college and no person be invited to address a meeting without Principal's prior permission. Hanging any poster or any notice without Principal's permission is prohibited.
 - Students should take care of the college property and should help in keeping the premises neat and clean. Any damage done to the property of the college is a breach of discipline.

- Malpractices in examination shall be severely dealt with.
- Any of the following acts by a student shall be considered as an offence against discipline.
 - Any offence committed by a student that goes against good administration and good working order of the college.
 - (ii) Habitual unpunctuality.
 - (iii) Various forms of immoral acts.
 - (iv) Use of any intoxicating drugs in the premises and compound of the college.
 - (v) Showing discourtesy to the teachers and staff members in any form.
 - (vi) Restoring violence of any kind.
 - (vii) Holding any meeting or party of a political character in the campus without prior written permission or against the order of the Principal.
 - (viii) Any act that is an offence and punishable under the Indian Penal Code or punishable under any special or local laws.
 - (ix) Ragging of any form.

COLLEGE UNIFORM:

Students shall have to come to the college in college uniform prescribed by the college. Newly admitted students can get information regarding uniform from the Uniform Advisory Committee of the college.

For breach of college discipline by a student, the Principal is authorized to punish the offender with appropriate punishment such as imposition of fine, suspension from the college, rustication or expulsion from the college as well as from the hostel in case of boarders, suspension, forfeiture or withdrawal of scholarship and other concessions attached to any scholarship, cancellation of all concessions.

The Head of the institution may order any undesirable and troublesome scholar to leave the institution without assigning any reason if such action is considered to be necessary for the good of the institution.

All powers for maintenance of discipline in the college are vested with the Principal and his decision shall be final in all such matters.
